Regarding your interesting article on Japanese expressions for China, Obaku Taihō (Ta-p'ing, 1691-1774) commonly called himself the "old laugher from China [Shina]" on the signatures on his bamboo paintings. Taihō was from Fukien, emigrated to Japan in 1722, and was twice abbot of Manpukuji (1745-48 and 1758-65). Other immigrant monks from China did not seem to use Shina or any other designation for China in their signatures.
